Key Vocabulary

Privacy settings	Settings that let you control who you share things with (e.g. public or friends)
Keywords	The most important words related to a subject
Copyright	The legal right to choose who can use your work
Strong password	A password that is difficult to guess. Combines cases, numbers and symbols
Spam	Unwanted messages that the recipient did not ask for
Virus	A software program that can damage other programs on a computer or device
Cyberbullying	Using the online devices to upset someone on purpose, often over and over again
